The League apologizes for some erroneous reporting over the last few bulletins regarding the low net leaders. I have been trying to train the junior scribe but he is incorrigible! Brady Paradis had moved up to B's for the second half and also should have been tied with Pete and Pierre. News

There was a lot of movement this week for many teams with the exception of Team 3 who held onto 1^{st} place by beating up on Team 5 to the tune of 44 to 28. All four groups won their matches led by Phil Duckett and sub Mike Huggins destroying Seth

Moyer and sub Jen Thomas 14 to 4. With the loss, Team 5, who had been in 2^{nd} place, dropped all the way back to $6^{th}!$ I'm sure the Velasco father/son duo cannot be pleased with this. If it is any consolation to Taylor, many in the league (especially the D players) can't thank you enough for erecting such a sturdy fence on the 1^{st} hole. For many, what would have been an out of bounds drive has resulted in a hittable, albeit long, fairway second shot due to the great bounces they are receiving off the fence that will withstand the tests of time!

Team 8 made a big move and now find themselves in the 2nd spot. Fratus shot a 38 and took 13.5 points playing solo against Hillenbrand and Wind and the 8B group of Peter Lee and sub Dan Freitas humiliated Brereton and Murphy by the score of 14.5 to 3.5. When the scores were in one could hear Fratus in the distance yelling "Timmy, Timmy," Will Timmy and the Lords of the Underworld continue their fast track to the top?
