## Notes:

Captains should e-mail the handicapper, Pete Michno, no later than 1100 Wednesday to give their line-ups. However, I'm sure the handicapper would appreciate Captains providing the line-ups earlier if you have them set. 1100 on Wednesday should be the exception, not the rule.

Captains should inform all retirees and non-NUWC members on their teams to use the website for all League information.

Please pay attention to the rules of scoring matches when there is a Noah. Remember that the matches are one on one and the tick marks for handicaps need to be adjusted accordingly for each individual match. The league officers have listed this in the rules and the daily blast has mentioned this numerous times, even including examples of how to score and also suggesting that you go into the clubhouse, get two more cards and keep two scorecards, one for each match, so you won't be confused.

## Pace of Play (FormerlySlow Play Watch):

The first group completed their match in less than 2 hours. By the time the 4:22 and 4:30 tee time entered the $19^{\text {th }}$, it took them over 3 hours. They actually teamed up as a Fivesome so they could complete the rounds before it got dark. There was a twosome and a foursome way ahead of them that joined up because they seemed to be waiting.
