My fellow golfers we have had no Holes in one this week.

Tod Camara must really have not liked his partner last year (Michno), since Camara was finally spotted in the clubhouse after the round. He was nonexistent last year in the 19th hole.

A two on to one match turned into a two on to zero match, when Cliff Curtis needed to walk off the course after 6 holes. This shows the importance of trying to fill all the spots on your team. Due to the 6 free points that Pete Decoste's team picked up, it allowed him to trash talk about how many points his team took this week. Smoke and mirrors Pete, smoke and mirrors.

There were people questioning the handicap of a 16 handicapper shooting a 43 , which was a net 27. Most of the questions were coming from the team that played against the person who shot a 43 . This was a valid score and it has been counted.

John McNeil shot a very good round of 53 , even with two 9s on the card

Gino's Shaw's Putter (see enclosed photo)
(Uses the new SHAWS absorption material to soften your Putts and make them roll Truer).


I sound silly telling a bunch of engineers who I know all learned to count in kindergarten and how to score, but we have to address this issue which I've heard is running rampant. When you are putting and someone says to you "You can have that" Or "That's good" it doesn't mean they are counting your last stroke as going in! When someone says this to you it means you can count the next putt as good. Ergo you ALWAYS need to add 1 more stroke to your total for the hole.

We don't have a clean \& place policy even in the fairway. We have a roll in your own fairway policy. Rolling of the ball in the fairway within a few inches is allowed using your club only. To be clear, the only place you can clean your ball is once it's on the green unless conditions are poor and you and your opponents agree before the round begins to clean and place where this only applies in the fairway. In the rough it is NEVER OK to fluff or clean \& place a ball or to move it out of a divot. The rough is there to penalize you for not hitting the fairway. See the Etiquette and Local Rules @ http://ngloob.com/?page_id=340. If rainy or wet conditions exist, players will be notified if Lift-Clean-Place is in effect by the League President.

A reminder regarding drop situations. A good way to remember how many clubs you get in a drop situation is this: "1st one is free. The 2nd one you pay for." If you're getting free relief (e.g. cart path), you get one club length. If you're taking a penalty for something, you get 2 clubs. Remembering this will alleviate any kind of headache trying to remember how many clubs you get to use for your drop.

Captains should call/e-mail the handicapper, Pete Michno, no later than 1100 Thursday to give their line-ups. However, I'm sure the handicapper would appreciate Captains providing the line-ups earlier if you have them set. 1100 on Thursday should be the exception, not the rule.

## Captains should inform all retirees and nonNUWC members on their teams to use the website for all League information.
