Walk to your ball (taking care to mind those hitting behind you for safety), and then hit it when ready. You should only be waiting long enough for the golfers ahead of you to clear safely out of range before you can hit. The first group was fast because they had a "Squirrel on Crack" which is a nickname given to Barbara Keller by some GVCC members because she exemplifies the concept of ready golf. Barb never stops moving until she's on the green knowing it's harder to hit moving target. Save your chatting for the greens and the tee boxes and abstain on the fairways and we'll all play faster rounds.

Notes:

We don't have a clean & place policy even in the fairway. We have a roll in your own fairway policy. Rolling of the ball in the fairway within a few inches is allowed using your club only. To be clear, the only place you can clean your ball is once it's on the green unless conditions are poor and you and your opponents agree before the round begins to clean and place where this only applies in the fairway. In the rough it is **NEVER** OK to

fluff or clean & place a ball or to move it out of a divot. The rough is there to penalize you for not hitting the fairway. See the Etiquette and Local Rules @ http://ngloob.com/?page_id=340. If rainy or wet conditions exist, players will be notified if Lift-Clean-Place is in effect by the League President.

A reminder regarding drop situations. A good way to remember how many clubs you get in a drop situation is this: "1st one is free. The 2nd one you pay for." If you're getting free relief (e.g. cart path), you get one club length. If you're taking a penalty for something, you get 2 clubs. Remembering this will alleviate any kind of headache trying to remember how many clubs you get to use for your drop.

Captains should call/e-mail the handicapper, Pete Michno, no later than 1100 Thursday to give their line-ups. However, I'm sure the handicapper would appreciate Captains providing the line-ups earlier if you have them set. 1100 on Thursday should be the exception, not the rule.

Captains should inform all retirees and non-NUWC members on their teams to use the website for all League information.


