Unlike polo, players don't need to be smug yuppie aristocratic inbred dweebs.

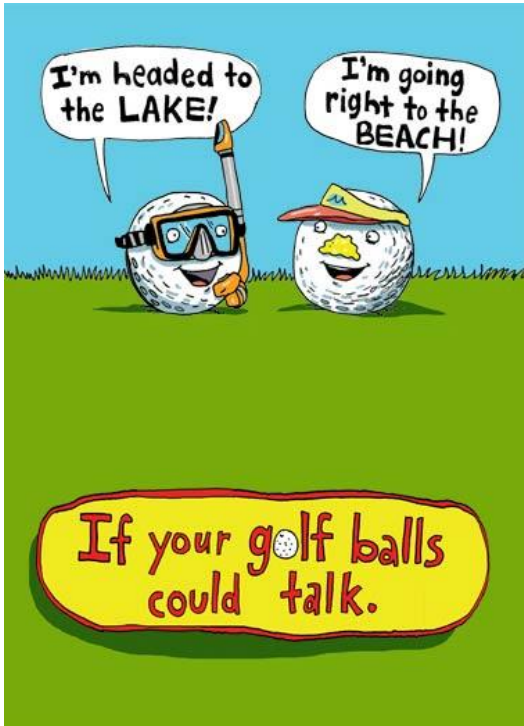
